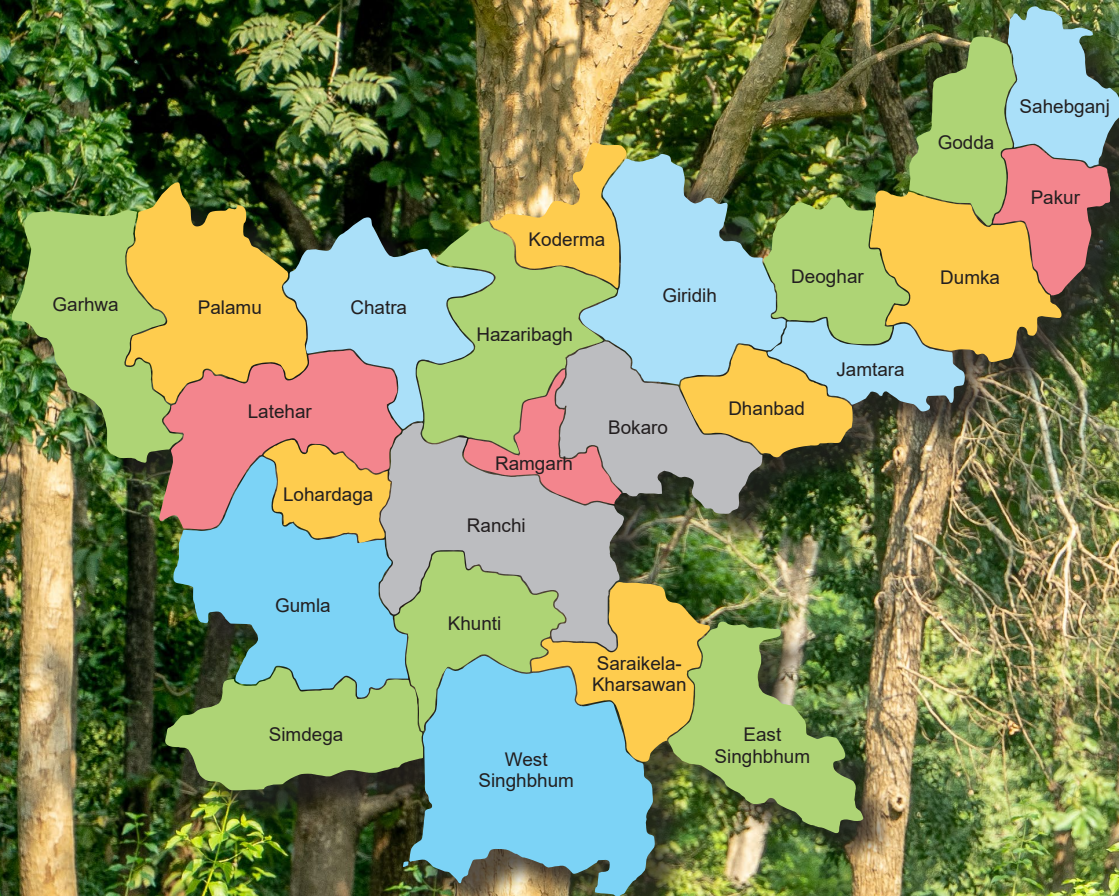

Jharkhand means land of forest. The state was formed in 2000, from the territory that had previously been part of Bihar. Jharkhand is surrounded by Bihar to the north, Uttar Pradesh and Chhattisgarh to the west, Odisha to the south and West Bengal to the east. The state covers a geographical area of 79.70 lakhs hectare. Jharkhand is located in eastern India with its capital at Ranchi and sub-capital at Dumka. Jharkhand is 15th largest state in area and 14th largest state in population.

Many parts of Jharkhand state lie on the Chotanagpur Plateau. Chotanagpur Plateau is the source of the Koel, Damodar, Brahmani, Kharkaiamd Subarnarekha rivers, whose watersheds lie within Jharkhand.

Demographics:

According to the 2011 Indian Census, Jharkhand has a population of 32.96 million, consisting of 16.93 million males and 16.03 million females. The sex ratio is 947 females to 1,000 males. The literacy rate of the state was 67.63% with Ranchi district being most educated at 77.13% compared to rural Pakur district being least at 50.17%. The population density of the state is 414 persons per square kilometre of land, however, it varies from as low as 148 persons per square kilometre in Gumla district to as high as 1167 square kilometre in Dhanbad district.

Culture and Language:

The population of Jharkhand consists of 28% tribals, 12% scheduled castes and others forming remaining population. Jharkhand has 32 tribal groups. The major tribes are Birhor, Ho, Paharia,

Munda, Oraon, Santhal, etc. Hinduism is the majority religion in the state with 68.5% of the population practicing the faith. Islam is followed by 13.8% of the population and the Animistic Sarna religion is practised by 13% of the population. Christianity with 4.1% of the population is the fourth largest religious community in Jharkhand. Jainism, Buddhism and Sikhism are practised by less than 1% of the population. In general, the culture of rural Jharkhand traces the tradition of the tribal society of Indian society, also remaining unperturbed by the trends of modernization. Rather, it asserts its originality and ethnicity and continues to do so. Music, dance, life style and art are the torch bearers of this trend of the cultural tradition. In general, the culture of urban Jharkhand is like any other urban areas in northern India.

Hindi is the official language in Jharkhand and is spoken by the people of the state, although different regions have their own languages. These include Nagpuri, Khortha, Magahi and Bhojpuri. Jharkhand has accorded second language status to Angika, Bengali, Bhojpuri, Ho, Kharia, Kurukh, Khortha, Kurmalio, Magahi, Maithili, Mundari, Nagpuri, Odia, Santhali and Urdu.

Administrative Divisions:

The state was formed with 18 districts that were formerly part of South Bihar. Some of these districts were reorganised into six new districts and now, number of districts is 24. At present, Jharkhand has 5 divisions, 24 districts, 38 subdivisions and 260 blocks for administrative

purposes. One interesting thing about Jharkhand is that all its districts, except Lohardaga and Khunti, share a border with a neighbouring state.

Jharkhand has 81 Assembly Constituencies and 14 Parliamentary Constituencies in 24 districts. Lohardaga is the smallest districts comprising of only one full assembly constituency while Ranchi district is the largest district with six full assembly constituencies. Out of the total number of Assembly Constituencies, the general ACs are 45, SC ACs are 9 and ST ACs are 27. Out of the total number of Parliamentary Constituencies, the General PCs are 8, SC PCs is 1 and ST PCs are 5.

Electoral Profile

Healthy electoral roll is the first primary target of the SVEEP activities in the financial year 2021-22 and the second primary target of the SVEEP is higher voter turnout in the bye-election if any. As of now, there is no bye-election in the current financial year, the only target for SVEEP activities in the current financial year is healthy electoral roll by enrolling all eligible voters in the electoral roll and further, electoral roll should be error-free in all parameters of healthy electoral roll.

Status of Electoral Roll:

Special Summary Revision 2021 is the last major revision of electoral roll happened in Jharkhand and continuous updation of electoral roll is in progress. Major parameters of the existing electoral roll are as follows:

However, the Gender Ratio of Jharkhand as per Census 2011 is 947 and the above data reflects there is large section of female voters are outside electoral roll. EP Ratio and Gender Ratio of each Assembly Constituencies is given in Annexure-1 with special focus on 18-19 Age Group Electors.

DSE is an important parameter to identify repeated entry of same voter in the electoral roll in the state. This needs verification of each DSE reflected in the ERONET. DSE pending in each ACs is given in Annexure-2.

Logical error is an important toll to identify errors in the electoral roll which needs intervention of the competent officer to manually verify and correct such mistakes in the electoral roll. Logical errors and repeat EPIC pending in each ACs is given in Annexure-3.

(iv) Status of Applications:

In spite of timelines fixed by ECI for disposal of applications, there is huge delay in disposal of applications and in some cases, the number of days of pendency is more than 100 days.

In order to ensure better participation of electors in the electoral process, Assured Minimum Filialities are to be ensured across the booths. The status of AMF in booths is far from satisfactory. AMF across the booths in each ACs is given in Annexure-4.

Comparative of Health of Electoral Roll:

Election Commission of India maintains online comparative health status of electoral roll across the states and UTs, in addition to across the districts. As on 22nd June 2021, Jharkhand rank is 15 which is below average and Jharkhand performance is worst in DSE and rank is 22. This needs serious introspection. Again, the ranking across the districts is also provided below as on 22nd June 2021. Some districts need serious attention to improve the health of the electoral roll.

Improving Health of Electoral Roll:

In the current financial year, in order to improve the health of the electoral roll, efforts should be made through SVEEP activities in the on-going continuous revision and forthcoming Special Summary Revision 2022. SVEEP activities should focus on the following activities for better health of electoral roll.

- ❖ Enrolling all Un-enrolled eligible Citizens/ Prospective electors eligible on 01.01.2022.
 - ◆ Collect the list of students who appeared in the +2 exams last year backwards and metric exams three years backwards from the nearby schools.
 - ◆ Collect the adolescent girls list from nearby ICDS centers.
 - ◆ Collect the student list from nearby colleges.
 - ◆ Collect the newly married couples, especially brides name list from the villagers and mohalas
 - ◆ Collect the tenants name from the houseowners
- ❖ Deletion of identified Repeat/Multiple entries/ Demographically Similar Entries after service of due notice and after following due process of law.
- ◆ Recently shifted person from the villagers/ mohalas
- ◆ List of persons having more than one place of residences
- ❖ Removal of Dead electors including Registered Dead /Permanently Shifted Electors.
 - ◆ Collect the list of recently dead persons from the villagers/mohalas and death certificate issued by competent authorities
- ❖ Flagging of PwD electors and Marked electors.
- ❖ Correction in ER entries and replacement of photos of electors who cannot be recognised.
- ❖ 100% physical verifications and rationalisation of polling stations (including standardisation and mapping of polling stations If required).
- ❖ Tagging of families to avoid splitting of family members

Electoral profile discussed above clearly mentions about the weak links in creating healthy electoral role in the state and also points out the major poor performing districts in the state. The proposed SVEEP Action Plan for 2021-22 should focus on these weak links for better performance in the coming days.



Voter Turnout: An Analysis

Voter turnout is the second most important parameter to assess the electoral participation by voters and higher voter turnout is a healthy sign for any democracy. Analysis of voter turnout should be done separately for parliament election and assembly election.

Elections Voter Turnout:

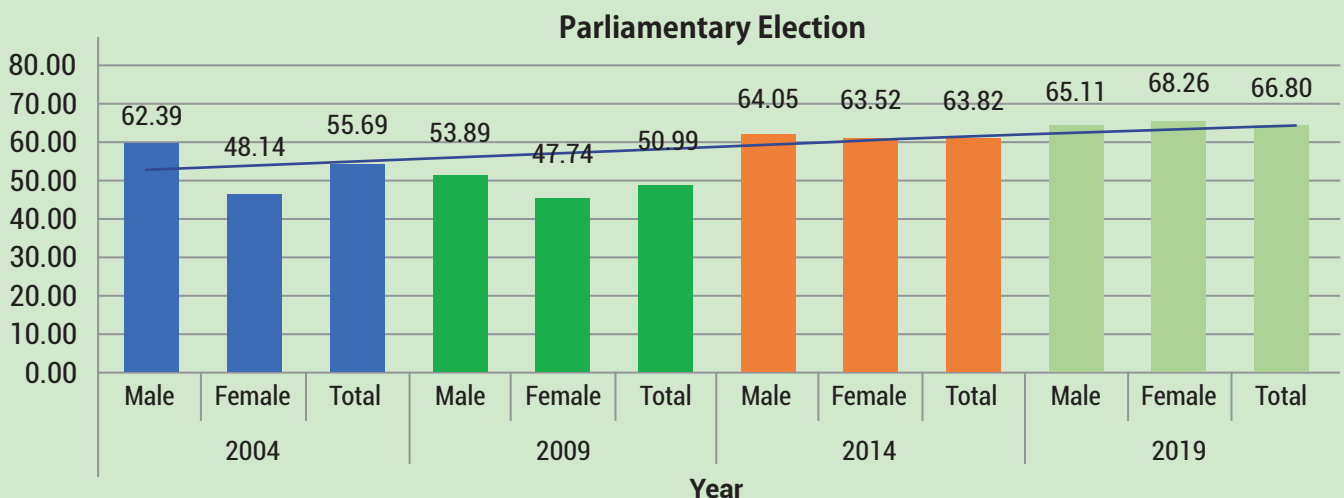
Since the formation of Jharkhand, four parliamentary elections and four assembly elections have been conducted so far in 2004, 2009, 2014 and 2019. The voting percentage is shown in the table below:

Each assembly constituency wise and parliamentary constituency wise voter turnout percentage is given in the annexure -5. It is to be noted that the voter turnout in urban constituency is lower than the state average. This urban apathy or other reasons to be addressed through SVEEP activities.

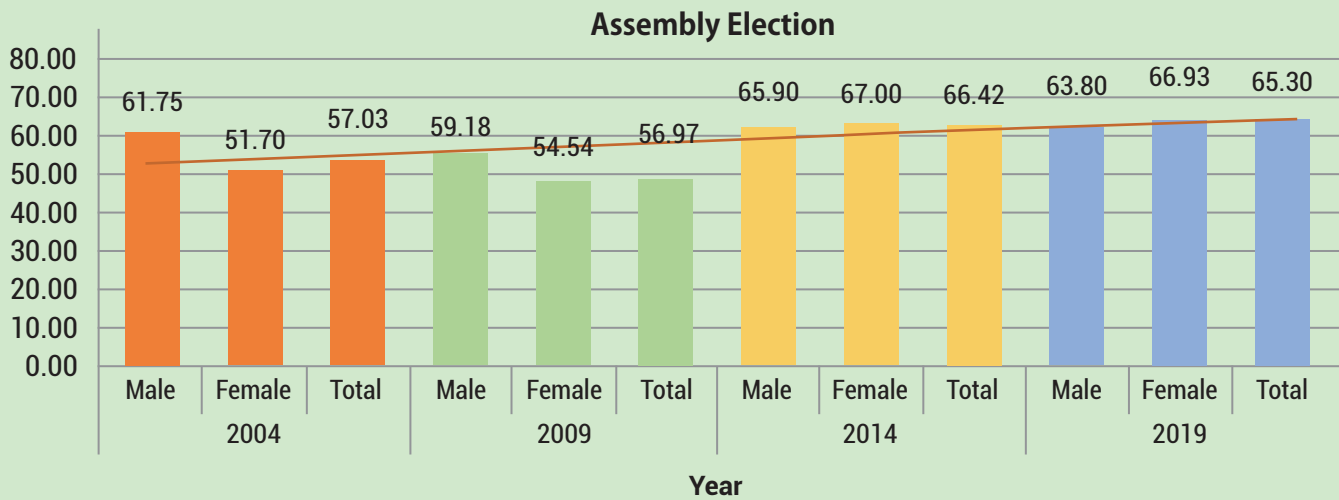
Parliamentary Election Voter Turnout Chart:

Assembly Election Voter Turnout Chart:

Since the formation of Jharkhand, four assembly elections have been conducted so far in 2004, 2009, 2014 and 2019. The voting percentage in the assembly election since formation of Jharkhand is shown in the chart below:



From the above charts, it is clear that there is increase in voter turnout due to consistent SVEEP activities in the state and thus, these activities need further strengthening.

Recent Assembly Bye-Election Voter Turnout:

Bye-Election for Dumka and Bermo Assembly Constituencies were held in the month of November 2020 and Bye-Election for Madhupur Assembly Constituency was held in the month of April, 2021. The voter turnout percentage in the assembly bye-elections is as follows:

When compared to general Assembly Election held in 2019, the voter turnout in all these bye-election constituencies is less. It is to be noted here that the above bye-elections were held during Covid19 pandemic. In spite of Covid19, voter turnout was reasonably encouraging.

Impact of SVEEP:

SVEEP activities are introduced in the India's electoral process since 2009. Above analysis clearly shows, there is increase in participation of voters in both parliamentary and assembly election, even though, there is minor variation across the district and constituencies in the state. SVEEP activities helped in creating awareness among the voters, candidates and political parties about the protocols to be followed during Covid19 pandemic. Another important impact of SVEEP is that female voter turnout in both parliamentary and assembly election is more than male voter turnout. This shows better electoral participation among female voters.

Strengthening Institutional Mechanism

Under the guidance of Election Commission of India, various committees, groups, etc were established under the chairpersonship of Chief Electoral Officer, District Election Officer and other officers under the Dept of Cabinet (Election) for implementation of SVEEP activities. However, these institutions were challenged by the Covid19 pandemic and their normal functioning were disturbed by this pandemic. Thus, these institutions need strengthening to improve its performance and also to overcome the devastation caused by this pandemic.

Core Committee:

Core committee for SVEEP had been notified under the Chairmanship of Chief Electoral Officer and senior officers were nominated as members with the approval of competent authority. However, due to Covid19 pandemic, normal functioning of this core committee was disturbed. This core committee should be re-notified with officers of appropriate seniority at the cutting-edge level as members for effective functioning.

State Committee on Electoral Literacy (SCEL):

SCEL was formed under the chairpersonship of CEO to supervise the planning, implementation, monitoring and evaluation of the programme for electoral literacy in the state. Regular review meeting should be conducted to reignite the electoral literacy activities in the state.

District Committee on Electoral Literacy (DCEL):

DCEL was formed under the chairpersonship of DEOs to supervise the planning, implementation, monitoring and evaluation of the programme for electoral literacy in the state. Regular review meeting should be conducted at district level to review the progress of electoral literacy programme in the districts.

Electoral Literacy Clubs (ELC):

Four different types of Electoral Literacy Clubs were formed at the field level since 2018 to spread electoral literacy among the masses. ELCs were established as per the following patterns:

- ❖ ELC Future Voters- for classes IX to classes XII (Secondary and Senior Secondary Level).



- ❖ ELC New Voters- College, University, all other educational institutions including professional and technical educational institutions.
- ❖ Chunarv Paathshala- ELC in communities for the youth, villagers especially illiterate women who are not a part of the formal education system.

❖ Voter Awareness Forums- In Government Departments, Organizations, Autonomous Bodies, Semi-Government Organizations, Non-Governmental Organizations and private sector organizations.

These ELCs should be strengthened in the current financial year further to boost the electoral literacy among the common voters.

Common Service Centres (CSC):

Election Commission of India recognised Common Service Centers as its partner to deliver election related services to common people in the field level. These CSCs should be strengthened further in the current financial year to deliver election related services to common people.

Manpower for SVEEP:

Even though CEO office has nodal officer for SVEEP activities at state level but he/she does not have subject experts to support SVEEP activities. In the current financial year, it is proposed to recruit

Social Media Expert and dedicated manpower for Web Radio from the Dept. of Public Relation and Information. In addition to this, manpower handling 1950 should be extensively used in the SVEEP related activities in the state and district level in addition to their handling of grievances of voters. Apart from above, agencies will be empanelled to develop creative contents for SVEEP activities.

Empanelment of Creative Agencies:

SVEEP activities need lot of creative products for communication with voters and other stakeholders. In the current financial years, creative agencies will be empanelled for long term partnership with them, so that capacity building of creative agencies and internal staff and officers can happen over a period of time. DEOs at the field level can also use the service of these creative agencies within their budget availability for SVEEP activities.



Planned Activities for 2021-22

Covid19 pandemic is creating unprecedented situation in the human history. All SVEEP activities should follow Covid19 SoPs. In addition to this, the current financial year being a non-election year as no bye-election is due and general election will be held only in the year 2024, this year SVEEP activities should concentrate more on electoral registration, delivery of electoral services and general knowledge about electoral system in the country. Thus, theme for the current year SVEEP is **Healthy Roll Healthy Poll**.

Continuous Roll Revision and SSR 2022:

Continuous electoral roll updation and special summary revision 2022 shall be the important activity during the current financial year. SVEEP activities and collaterals should be prepared for creating awareness among the voters and other stakeholders. In the current year, all BLOs will be provided with BLO kit to discharge their responsibilities. They will be sufficiently trained to use GARUDA App and interaction with CSCs. Special focus should be given for enrolment of PwD voters, senior citizens and electors in vulnerable pockets and communities.

Branding of CSC:

Election Commission of India had acknowledged Common Service Centers or Pragiya Kendra as Voter Facilitation Centers and service charge is fixed for each service to common citizens. In the current year, these Pragiya Kendra should be branded as Voter Facilitation Centers through various ways like fixing voter facilitation center board in each Pragiya Kendra, digital training for each VLEs, development of knowledge decimation collaterals for VLEs, review meeting with VLEs at ERO level, etc.

Digital Election:

Digitization and online medium have entered into to all the components of social, economic and

cultural space of human life and election should not be an exemption to this. Digital election should focus on following three components:

- ❖ Popularisation of APPs and Portals: ECI has developed Apps for voter facilitation like Voter Helpline App, portals like www.NVSP.gov.in, etc. These digital platforms should be popularised through SVEEP activities.
- ❖ Digital Learning for Voters/Polling Personals: Online learning has taken CenterStage during current Covid19 pandemic and digital learning should be expanded to electoral literacy for common voters, political parties, etc and polling staffs.
- ❖ Digital Polling: More and more Apps should be developed and adopted from other states for polling processes like vehicle management, material management, Postal ballot management, etc. These Apps should be popularised through SVEEP activities.

Turnaround 20:

Twenty assembly constituencies with least voter turnout during the last assembly election should be selected and SVEEP activities should be undertaken to improve voters' registration, deletion of shifted/dead voters, formation of

ELCs and other voter facilitation activities. Nodal Officer at CEO office level should be identified for each assembly constituency for Turnarund20 activities.

Replacement EPIC:

ECI launched a new scheme for free replacement of EPIC card for voters. SVEEP activities should be concentrated in a such a way that voters may be encouraged to update their photos and correction if any in the EPIC. In other words, more focus should be given to Form 8, rather than Form 001.

Establishment of SVEEP e-Library/Museum:

DEOs at the district level and also CEO office at over the period of time developed many SVEEP collaterals like Posters, Videos, etc. These collaterals need to be stored in public platform for official purpose and also for private persons. During the development of SVEEP collaterals more focus should be given for local artisans and locations within Jharkhand. Creative product development agency for SVEEP should be

sensitised on this issue. NIC or JAPIT or any other agency may be roped in for the development of digital library/Museum for SVEEP.

Social Media Communication with ELCs:

Electoral Literacy Clubs are spread across the state in various formats. As SVEEP team has roped in Social Media Consultants, social media platforms like Youtube, Facebook, Twitter and Instagram should be used for cost effective communication with ELCs. Partner creative product development agencies should be advised to develop creative products for electoral education.

Celebration of NVD and Other National/ International Days:

National Voter's Day is an important SVEEP activity every year since launch of SVEEP. This year onwards CEO office should greet in online medium and social media for engaging continuously with voters. Greeting posters can be sent online through Facebook, Twitter and Instagram as part of 360* coverage and 365 days engagement with voters.

SVEEP activities shall be executed both at the DEO and CEO level involving all field functionaries. Tentative expenditure for SVEEP activities for the financial year 2021-22 shall be as follows:
